

oing on a vacation to the Olympics this summer? Maybe to the San Juans? If you are going anywhere within the Puget Sound area, R+E Cycles wants to help you have a great time while you're there, especially if you'll be cycling during any part of it. We have all experienced the heavy traffic on Seattle's streets and trails, and have yearned for a stretch of road where we can be virtually alone for long periods of time. Many roads on the Olympic Peninsula and in the Gulf Islands offer this escape. Whether you are a recreational cyclist or are in training for a crosscountry trip, the region around the Puget Sound offers some of

the finest cycling in the country. If you plan to stay overnight, you may also consider the options open to you. Aside from motels, one option for an overnight stay is a bed and breakfast. This type of accommodation has been rapidly growing in the Northwest and several dozen b&b's exist within easy biking range. Long popular in England, a bed and breakfast offers a great place to relax after a day on the road. Comfortable lodging, excellent food, and occasionally a hot tub, or other similar amenities await. Call the local Chamber of Commerce for information on b&b's in the area you'll be travelling through. Another way to spend your

evening is in a state or county campground. Many have special areas set aside specifically for hikers and cyclists. The rates are usually lower and the sites are a bit more rustic. And you will have an advantage over car campers - there will almost always be space in the hiker/biker areas. And for the more adventuresome, possibilities may exist down just off any side road. Respect private property and signs. The best way to get from here to there is often by the ferry system. Some options exist here. Either put your bike in your car, and take both to your destination, or just take your bike, hope for good weather, and sail off into the

sunset. And what's there once you arrive? That's where a good set of maps comes in handy. R+E Cycles carries Eagle Eye Maps and The Seattle Bicycle Atlas. Eagle Eye Maps feature extensive topographical descriptions of many areas around the Puget Sound. They show bed and breakfasts, campgrounds, grades, such things as exceptional views, bike shops, water, and even spas. These maps will represent \$3.00 well spent. The Seattle Bicycle Atlas offers rides closer to Seattle. It provides 33 ways not to get lost in and around Seattle. But it also gives you 33 ideas of ways to spend an afternoon, or a day on your bike.



The San Juan Islands



ew places in the Northwest have as much draw as the San Juan Islands. Even fewer places live up to such expectations as those evoked by the thought of a visit to one or more of the several hundred islands in that group.

Some of the islands are no larger than a house, however the ones that allow for it are excellent for cycling, offering everything a cyclist could hope for with their small towns, good roads, miles of rolling hills, and plenty of magnificent views. Though most island cycling is relatively easy, there are some fairly stiff hills available such as 2408 foot Mount Constitution, in Orcas Island's Moran State Park. This is the highest point on the islands and is well worth the struggle to reach the top, From this peak, you can see most of the San Juan Islands group, and well into Vancouver Island and Washington. Be sure to take your binoculars, occasionally Oreas are sighted, and a


bald eagle may glide past. There are six campgrounds on Orcas Island, most in or near Moran State Park. Another campground is located at West Beach. Also, several bed and breakfasts are available in East Sound, West Sound, and in between. Reservations should be made far in advance for this type of accommodation as they are usually booked solid through the summer months. Fall in the San Juans is beautiful, and with fewer tourists, lodging in bed and breakfasts can be easier to arrange.

San Juan Island itself is not so travelled as the others, and offers more open roads. It has three campgrounds and a few bed and breakfasts. This island is the site of the famous Pig War between the United States and Great Britain during the last century, and has two parks. English Camp and American Camp to designate the spots where each side held claim to the Island for its own country.

Lime Kiln State Park is also a popular spot to watch for oreas which come in close to feed. San Juan Island is mostly rolling with a few grades, but none are difficult. And Friday Harbor has a bike shop. Lopez Island also has three campgrounds, two bed and breakfasts, and a bike shop, and is the first stop on the ferry from Anacortes. Shaw and Guemes Islands are the other two major islands in the group which are serviced by the Washington State Ferry System. Shaw is the only one with a campground. The campgrounds on the San Juan Islands are run by the county, by the state, or privately. The amenities of each campground will vary from primitive to relatively luxurious with showers and grocery stores. The average cost for a tent site is about \$10.00, which seems high, particularly when the cost for a fully outfitted RV with water, sewage and electrical hookups is only a few dollars more. But, unless you

have it in mind to find your own site, this is the cost. Bed and breakfasts are a great alternative to camping though. Cyclists have a good reputation among the owners of these establishments for being model guests and often times find themselves drawn into conversations about their travels which may lead them to otherwise unknown destinations. The rates at bed and breakfasts, though not cheap, are reasonable when you consider what they offer, and their alternatives. This is rapidly becoming a very popular form of accommodation for cyclists who prefer to travel light and let someone else take care of food and lodging. For more information about bed and breakfasts, contact the local Chamber of Commerce. For more about camping, contact the state or county parks office, or the Chamber of Commerce. WHAT'S HOT!!

R+E Cycles has several new items which you should check out. The first is a sports nutritional system called Exceed. Three different formulas offering three kinds of benefits round out the system. One is for replenishing lost fluids due to strenuous exercise. One helps add lean muscle and weight, and the third provides for more endurance while training. Exceed comes in two flavors, and either powder or liquid. Computers are not just for playing games anymore, especially when they are cycle computers. Remember the kind of speedometer that had the huge dial that never really worked below 10 mph or above 20 mph? Now, there are computers. R+E has ten different models to choose from. These range from the Cyclotech, with three functions - speed, trip distance, and total distance - to the Cateye Solar which has those functions plus cadence, highest speed, average speed, a clock, and even a pulse reading (with a special accessory sensor). In addition, its solar cell recharges its batteries. Other computers to consider are from Avocet, Rhode Gear, a couple others by Cateye, and Vetta. And we do have the old standby mechanical kind for the purist.

Rhode Gear has a handlebar bag which is worth close attention. It's called the Universal H/B Pack and features quick release Velcro straps for the bar and elastic tensioners. This is a lightweight bag which holds a lot in its main compartment and three smaller pockets. Finally, Blackburn, the maker of many fine cycling accessories has introduced two new workstands. The floor model is made of fat tubular steel and is extremely sturdy and stable. The benchtop version is the same thing, only sawed off, with a plate attached to the bottom to bolt it down. The workstands will hold any bike, even upside down. We have one set up on the floor. Come in and look.

Rodriguez and Erickson Custom Frames

R+E Cycles is a custom frame specialist with a strong emphasis on tandems and small frames. We have implemented an "a la carte" system. You choose the style of frame you want and then you choose from a menu of parts. You can

create anything you want. This system allows our customers to know their choices and what they will cost. The result is a custom frame designed for the individual.

Erickson

Erickson bikes and frames are a product of Glenn Erickson's commitment to cycling excellence. Glenn has raced for years, winning the 1982 Washington State Road Championships and holding the Seattle To Portland tandem record. He tours, rides offroad, and hauls his children in a trailer. He knows how a frame should work and has the skill of an artist to make Erickson frames some of the most valued in the country. In addition to the stock Erickson racing frames, he does custom lugless frames for all styles of riding. Each one is a work of art.

The base of an Erickson frame is a fully butted Reynolds 531 tubeset. Joined under Glenn's expert torch and hand-finished, each frame does what it's designed to do, whether it's on a tight criterium course or touring where and how you've always wanted to go.

The stock Erickson racing frame is available in sizes every centimeter from 46 cm to 66 cm (that's 18" to 26"). Each racing frame includes the following features:

- + Reynolds 531 double butted tubing
- + top tube brake cable guides
- + under bottom bracket gear cable guides
- + down tube shift lever bosses
- + Campagnolo 1010B dropouts

Each frame is finished after its multi-coat DuPont Imron paint has the decals topped with a clear coat and is baked in a temperature controlled oven. Standard frames feature the metallic Imrons which positively sparkle under the sunlight. Optional paint finishes are flat colors, fades, panels and, of course, chroming.

R+E's Ride Price Matrix

Before we order any bikes at R+E Cycles we make a ride/ price matrix to see where the bike will fit in our scheme. You can use this to help determine what sort of bike (and maybe what price level) you'll buy.

The matrix is very simple. The vertical component is price; the horizontal is the type of ride. The type of ride is a continuum from touring to sport to racing. Right now we haven't yet figured a good way to factor in mountain bikes, so we've simply left them off the matrix.

The horizontal range from touring to racing goes the full spectrum. A long wheelbase 18-speed fully racked bike will be all the way to the left. Such bikes are the Nishiki Cresta GT's and the Rodriguez

Touring. A full bore racing machine will be on the right; here you'll find the Erickson Racing and the upper level of the Bianchi and Nishiki line. In between are the vast majority of stock bicycles.

We draw a line right down the middle and call this the Sport line. Neither full out touring or racing, these are the bikes which you can use for all your cycling needs. As you can see from the matrix, most bikes under \$300 are close to the Sport line. As bikes get more specialized, they become more expensive.

The V shape seen on the matrix is found in most bicycle brands. The high end bicycle in the middle is the Rodriguez Sport which is unique in that it

is a true quality sport bike.

From the \$300 dollar level to the \$600 level the bikes tend to be more or less racing or touring. We sit down and figure out the specs, ride the bikes if we can, and determine how far from a true sport or how close to a true racing bike they are. Then we place them on the matrix to see how they fit. If the bike is obviously way off (can you imagine a full bore racing bike for example?) it stands out and we try to figure out if it is OK or if it is junk. Once we have filled our V curve, we order those bikes. Each bike brand may have 20 or 30 models but not all would suit our needs.


If you look closely at the specifications and ride the various models offered by one bike manufacturer, you may find some bikes which have the same basic frame and different

trappings. In some lines, for example, the sport bikes share the same basic frame but the componenets improve dramatically as you pay more money. Bianchi, as another example, makes a model called the Volpe which has a touring look on a sport frame. It's a rugged bike with 18 speed gearing and a rack that's proven to be very popular in the Northwest and especially in Seatttle.

Think carefully about your riding needs and then look at the matrix. Maybe you'll be commuting 50%, day riding 40%, and light touring for 10% - that's sport or light touring. If you are tri training and day riding, you'll be on the right hand side of the matrix.

Take some time and compare bikes. We've included a do-it-yourself bike comparison chart to help you compare bikes - see where the models fit in your matrix and buy with years of pleasure in mind.

KINDS OF BIKES: A simple comparison


SPORT — These bikes are probably the most popular of all bikes, a mix between racing and touring. Sometimes called fast-touring, they are great for general use: for day rides, short tours, and even occasional racing.


TOURING — They have a larger gear spread, a good comfortable seat, racks, and toe clips and straps. A touring bike can easily be used for commuting and most other utility trips making it also a very popular bike.

COMMUTING — This bike has a narrower gear range designed for just a few routes. It can have upright bars, has fenders and lights.

MOUNTAIN BIKE — This bike has "fat tires" 26 X 2.125, upright bars and a very wide gear range. Used for off road riding, makes a good commuting bike since it is almost indestructible.

RACING — These bikes are lightweight efficient machines built for speed. A very good choice for triathletes and those who love performance.

EDITORIAL

125 PSI, PLEASE

STP was great! Everyone had a good time in spite of the wind and rain on Saturday. And did it rain and blow. For the second year in a row. I went along and did free repairs to help get folks down to Portland. I honestly have to say that it is the highlight of my year. I must remind most of you that Estelle and the crew keep me around just to sign the checks and the only time I have to get chain grime under my fingernail is on STP. Dan Lund, good friend of the shop, our computer programer and my dentist came along and helped wrench all day. Carla and Kari helped sell inner tubes, gloves, jackets, tires, and everything you can imagine. We all had a good time. Several folks asked me what kinds of repairs were most common or what surprised me most during two non-stop days of repairs. The most common. repair was a broken spoke in the rear wheel which must have been every second repair. But we had our custom spoke-making machine and were able to fix all the different spokes we encountered. What surprised me the most? Well, we took three pumps with us so that folks could fill or refill their tires. It just so happened that none of the gauges worked on any of the three pumps. Eventually, we covered them with duct tape so that we didn't have to explain that this one was not accurate and that one only went up to 85 and the last one didn't even budge off zero. Bad gauges didn't surprise me. What did surprise me was the number of people that would not use the pumps or let us pump up their tires because we didn't have an accurate gauge. Mid-way into the second day I decided to try to find out what was so important about a gauge and discovered something amazing. Almost everyone was very concerned that if the tire said 125 psi by golly that was how much air was going to go into it not a pound more or less. I asked some of the riders if they thought that the 200 pound rider should have the same amount of air in his tire as the 105 pound, fit as a whistle, female triathlete. Or if one should put the same amount of air on a dry hot day as on a cold wet day. The answers varied but in the end they asked if I had a gauge and when I said I didn't they almost always decided that they didn't need air after all. That was the biggest surprise of the ride. Just to wrap up this subject, all I want to say is that the 125 psi on the side of the tire (and I called Specialized just to confirm my hunch) doesn't mean much. The pressure is different for each rider and each riding condition and the 125 psi on the side wall is just the max that a max person would want to put in it. I encourage every one of you who do this to let a little air out and then try your bike, you might find that is not only more comfortable, but holds the road better which, in reality, might mean faster.



I haven't raced a bike in I don't know how long, not since 1972 to be sure. But recently I went to White Pass for their Fat Tire Weekend. After the Novice group left, I asked the organizer if it might be ok if Carla and I when around the course leisurely and checked it out and he said sure. So after the initial dust settled. off we went, and just around the third turn I passed the first of the competitors, a mom and her I1 year old. Boy, was I feeling hot now. Somehow my pace picked up a little and a bit later I passed another competitor. I'm not

sure, but he looked like my grandfather. I passed him anyway. Shortly after that, I passed a guy by the side of the road fixing his rear derailleur and around the next corner I passed 10 riders who were at the first checkpoint drinking water and laughing about something and having a good time. Then we came to the big hill (not too big) and Carla just rode past me, I said something I about I'll talk to you tonight, but she just kept on going. Some of the guys who were laughing came by and then the ride was over. I had a great time and I encourage all of you to get on you bikes and have fun. I'll take some of that advice myself.

To end this column for this issue I would like to apologize for the errors in the last newsletter, there were many. I think because of STP we had a much bigger demand for some items than we had anticipated and ran out of them within hours of the newsletter coming out. Some items were special purchases which we could not get more of, so in some of our coupons you will see "limited to stock on hand". We hope to have enough for the duration of the newsletter, but when we run out, we're out. We also had some pictures that did not represent the items were were talking about and that got us into some trouble. And it was, thanks to all of you, the best month we have ever had. Thank you all for shopping.

MAILING LIST INFORMATION

How did you get on this mailing list? How do you get off this mailing list? It took us some time to figure out how to do it and we think we've developed a method. We take names off checks, repair tags, special orders, or you were asked if you wanted to be on, or a friend put you on. In any case, your label has two numbers on it. One is a reference number we use which changes every time we sort the list, and the other is the date you get purged off the list, one year from the last time your name was added to the list.

If you came into the store and paid with a check six times last month, you got on the list six times, which probably seems excessive, but just before we mail, we sort and purge and keep the latest dated entry for your name. If you do not get back on the list somehow within a year, when we sort and purge, your name will be purged. So, you might say that your subscription ends with the date on your label unless you come back in and get back on in one of the ways mentioned above.
